




So, what have we been working towards ahead of the new season?

Weeks of Action 2020

This season's 'Weeks of Action' will take place between 29 February and 15 March, where we aim to celebrate the positive initiatives undertaken by clubs, sporting venues, and their governing bodies in partnership with disabled sports fans and disabled supporters' associations.

What are the Level Playing Field Weeks of Action?

LPF's Weeks of Action were established in 2005 to help highlight the positive initiatives undertaken by clubs, sporting venues and their governing bodies in partnership with disabled sports fans and disabled supporters associations (DSAs).

The campaign, now an established date on the sports calendar, is a great opportunity for clubs to organise and host matchday and non-matchday events and activities to show their commitment to access and inclusion for disabled spectators.

DSA campaign packs will be out by the end of August.

Discrimination in Sport Debate

Level Playing Field Chair, Tony Taylor, provides a statement in response to the parliamentary debate that took place on Wednesday 12th June.

Tony Taylor, Chair of Level Playing Field said:

"Level Playing Field was interested to read the Parliamentary debate held on Wednesday 12th June on Discrimination in Sport.

It is important that everyone participating in, and attending sport, at any level can do so without being subjected to ugly abuse and discrimination.

Yesterday's debate in Parliament helped to raise the topic of unacceptable discrimination faced by sportsmen and women but we see it as an oversight that spectators were not included. We know from police figures and disabled fans contacting us that disability abuse is on the rise.

Furthermore, once again even at government level, we are faced with a hierarchy of protected characteristics under the Equality Act; racism, homophobia, antisemitism and sexism. In 2010 the Equality Act was passed to protect nine minority groups and that included disability, the largest minority group in any population, and so we ask the press and government alike to stop prioritising certain groups.

Level Playing Field asks anyone witnessing disability abuse at a sports event to report it. We provide support and advice and work closely with clubs and governing bodies to help stamp it out".

Newport County DSA

At Newport County we are going through a transitional phase with regards to responsibility and support around disabled supporters and accessibility. Colin Faulkner stood down as DSA Chair at the end of last season due to his election to a Club Director from Supporters Trust Members; his wife Claire took the role up but due to health issues for both Claire and the majority of the remaining committee they have been unable to move forward as they had hoped. Colin took a lot of the responsibilities to the club as a Voluntary DAO but other responsibilities have left him struggling to manage time between the various roles. As the Director responsible to the EFL for Equality and Diversity he has also had to look at other areas of the club and whilst keeping up to date he has not been able to be as active with forums and updates as he'd liked.

This season the SLO role has been fulfilled by Ben Jones who is now the first point of call for all matchday requirements and issues including accessibility. Colin is supporting Ben as he gets used to the role and working with him to improve process, policy and meeting needs – if you need to reach Ben you can do on FanFeedback@newport-county.co.uk and he will assist you on matchday queries. The DSA are looking to recruit some additional Committee Members supported by Colin and will probably be looking for a new Chair to drive this forward. We hope to arrange a meeting soon so the DSA can get back to being the driving force in supporting the club in this area. Hopefully when the next newsletter is due there will be some positive updates from the DSA along with updated contact details.





Exeter City DSA

ECDSA held their AGM on Tuesday 30th July which was well attended and 4 new members were voted onto the committee for the 2019/20 season after a volunteer search over the close season.

Roles for all committee members will be decided at their first committee meeting of the new season to be held on Tuesday 27th August.

Summary for the DSA is as follows:

- Dugout issue: The new dugouts were put in front of the Main Stand which made visibility of the game for users of accessible areas 2 and 3 very difficult. The positioning of the dugouts severely restricted the view of one half of the pitch and made it impossible to enjoy the match. With redevelopments complete these two areas are now unavailable on match days as the club have stopped selling tickets for these areas on the clubs Disability Liaison Officers advice.
- Bucket collection: The football club again kindly gave the DSA the opportunity to have a bucket collection which was held on Sat 1st September at the Lincoln City match. The collection raised £260.12
- ECFC Accessibility booklet: A new accessibility booklet has been put together which includes a breakdown of the Accessible facilities at the club plus the Disability and Assistance dogs Policies. The DSA paid to have 150 copies printed and copies are available from the club shop. The ECDSA Chairman Nick Saunders and David Jones (DSA Vice-chair) were joined by Nicky Baker from Level Playing Field at the Tranmere Rovers match on 2nd March to undertake a launch of the new booklet, which coincided with Level Playing Fields 'weeks of action' campaign 2018.

Exeter City DSA (continued)

- Re-development: A big thank you to the football club for taking onboard all the DSA's concerns and their understanding of the needs of those with disabilities. The club now have 41 (57 if needed) wheelchair spaces for home supporters, up from 34 spaces; 8 wheelchair spaces for away supporters, up from 3 spaces. A Changing places room equipped with a height-adjustable table, portable hoist and privacy screen provided by the DSA. Easy access to the new stand from the Stadium Way accessible entrance and a new perimeter walkway to the new stand, avoiding the large slope in St James Road, to the back of the stand from Well Street.
- End of seat hand rails: To help with accessibility and safety, both the IP Office Stand and the new Stagecoach Adam Stansfield Stand have been fitted with new and improved end of seat hand rails. Installation of hand rails to all of the IP Office stand was made possible by donations from supporter groups including ECDSA.
- Christmas draw: Draw took place on 12th December at the Park and was attended by City player & ECDSA President Lee Holmes, together with Russell Lemon from Exeter Nissan who helped to draw the lucky winning tickets. All in all, there were 31 prizes up for grabs with all prizes kindly being donated by Exeter Nissan, GreenMyBusiness, Signs Express, Mi Space, Subway of Sidwell Street, Mr Herniman, Hartley's Certified Accountants, Exeter City FC, Exeter City Directors and all our committee members. The draw raised over £1,700.
- Safety Netting: This was brought up at the last AGM. Safety netting was put up on the front of the front wheelchair areas in the Big Bank Stand. The nets were put up while the players were taking shooting practice and taken down for kick off.
- Portable Induction Loop: This was the first item the DSA bought the football club back in 2007. The system was not charging properly, so it was decided to purchase a new unit, which is hoped last as long as the old one did.
- Membership reach milestone: The DSA hope for many years was for their membership would reach the 100 mark and this was finally archived with the DSA finishing the season with a fantastic 142 members after a recruitment drive. The hard work has already started to build on this and can only happen with a hard-working committee who are dedicated and active.
